TALK: History of Hazells Hall and Landscape Speaker: Joanna Hewitt

From mid-16th century Hazells estate was owned by Burgoyne, Britain and Kingsley families. By the mid-18th

century, it had passed, by marriage, to Pym whose descendants still own the wider landscape.

The Hall was enlarged several times and occupied until 1942 by the Pym family. During WW2 it became a hostel for RAF pilots stationed at Tempsford. Post war it was used as a hospital and then left empty. It is now restored and converted into individual private dwellings.

Two notable landscapers have been left their mark on the grounds. Nathaniel Richmond instigated the impressive straight terrace. Humphry Repton moved

the road further to the east to provide a parkland view from the house, added a sinuous walkway but kept Richmond's terrace.

"... the straight terrace at the HASELLS ought not to be disturbed: although it is a remnant of geometric gardening of the last century, yet it is an object of such comfort and convenience, that it would be unpardonable to destroy it, for no other reason than because a straight walk is out of fashion ..."
