This ancient woodland is a county park mentioned in records from the 12th century. It contains a mixture of oak, ash, hornbeam, hazel, maple, elm, hawthorn, and holly. The wood was extended in the late 1990s. It has a rich history with earthworks possibly dating from the Iron Age. It has been used as a deer park and part of the wood contains ridge and furrow earthworks.
