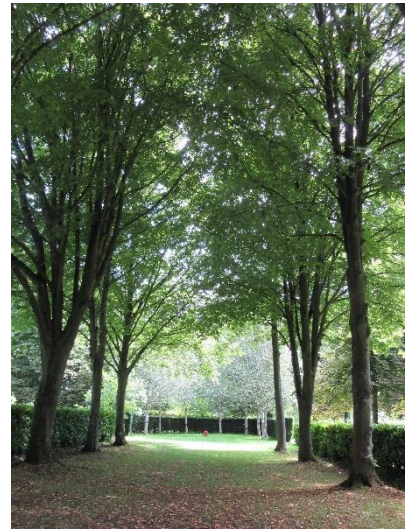

### Visit to Whipsnade Tree Cathedral



Particularly appropriate for the centenary celebrations marking the end of WW1 is a visit to this unusual memorial to soldiers who died. Listed Grade II in 2017 this is a distinctive designed landscape of which there are perhaps only 3 comparable examples worldwide.

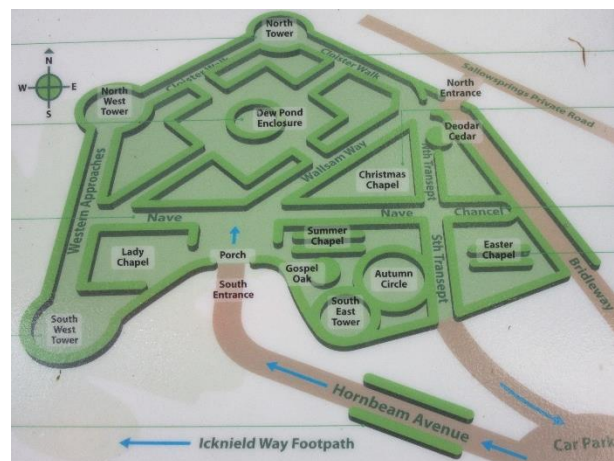
Edmund Blyth served in World War I and suffered the loss of dear friends. He wanted to create a lasting legacy and planted trees in the 1930s to form a cathedral.

**Directions:** LU6 2LQ Four miles south of Dunstable, off B4540.

From Dunstable and Kensworth:  
After passing the church on your left turn, right along Bushey close.  
From Whipsnade Zoo: after a sharp left bend turn left along Bushey Close.

**Parking:** free but spaces are limited
